1/17/13 - Commissioner Jonathan Mintz and Associate Commissioner Amelia Erwit, of the NYC Department of Consumer Affairs stopped by at AAARI to kick off training conducted by Executive Director, Joyce Moy. The participants were college faculty from six cities who received grants from the Cities for Financial Empowerment. The 45 hour curriculum which trains financial counselors embedded in community based organizations and government agencies was created by Joyce and has been adopted as a national model to be replicated across the United States. Joyce has trained over 175 counselors and agency professionals over the past several years in NYC. The cities participating in the training were Denver, Lansing, Nashville, Philadelphia, San Antonio and Seattle.

AAARI Receives Funding for APA New Yorkers Count Research

The Fund for Public Advocacy (FPA) has provided funding for AAARI to conduct research which includes disaggregation of Census data across five categories and over 20 ethnic API groups, to be followed by a community needs assessment survey. The FPA in partnership with the Coalition for Asian Children and Families want to "create awareness and action to support the community needs of Asian Pacific New Yorkers and community organizations that support them, based on demographics, service needs and gaps in services." Initial funding for the project was provided by the Ong Family Foundation.

The research will be led by Dr. Erica Chutuape, Research Coordinator at AAARI, who has extensive experience in research and has worked with closely community based organizations in the API community. She is currently an adjunct assistant professor in the Asian American Studies Program at Hunter College/CUNY.
